Al and the legend of St. Osyth

I had been mulling over a problem for some time and finally decided to enlist the help of AI. The legend of St. Osyth is a fascinating story that I tell to all the children who visit St. Osyth Priory in my role as Education Manager. I had an idea to write a version for younger children using rhyme to make it memorable and engaging. Several drafts of this later and the poem sat on my computer for over a year as I struggled to get the rhythm I was after without the rhyme sounding forced. AI has come on in leaps and bounds in recent years so I decided to try it out. I uploaded the poem I had and asked AI to suggest ways I could improve it. With



some back and forward with me experimenting on giving AI the instructions needed to get the response I was after, I finally had a story for young children that portrayed all the key elements of the legend in a fun and exciting way. I played around with AI to generate images to accompany the text and put it all together in a book.

This delightful book is now for sale locally at St. Osyth Museum, having been printed by Entrac. I am able to use it with school children who visit the Priory and bring the 1300 year old story to a modern audience, all thanks to collaborating with AI.
